The mission of our organization is to help improve the impoverished lives of the people of all faiths in Teotepeque, El Salvador and its surrounding villages. One hundred percent of our proceeds go to (1) support, supply, and maintain the only ambulance in the area; (2) provide the necessary medications and supplies for the yearly medical mission team; and (3) finance the building, installation and maintenance for small community water filtration systems. The lack of clean water has been identified by the medical mission team, as being a major contributor to ongoing health issues. Additionally, surplus money from our yearly fund raising effort (Super Bowl Party) has been used to pay for a community well, food for the needy, and to help support the local medical clinic.

AMBULANCE

- Ambulance service running since 2001
- Only method to reach nearest hospital for over 30,000 from 25 communities
- Average of 250 trips per year
- Countless lives saved



MEDICAL MISSION

WANTED

- Practitioners, dentists, nurses, pharmacists, Spanish translators and general helpers
- Week long trip providing free medical care to anyone in 4 different villages
- Mass celebrated with those we serve in the different village parishes



WATER TREATMENT

- Over 1/3 of sick have parasites from the local water
- In June of 2015, Mission Team built first drinking water filtration system, providing clean drinking water to the San Pedro Catholic Academy students, parish workers, Mass participants, visitors, and Mission Center
- There are dozens of other churches, schools and villages in need of clean drinking water in this region of El Salvador!
